### **Directions to Charles City County Fair**

Located at Charles City Recreation Center

8320 Ruthville Road - Route 612

#### **From West - Hopewell, Henrico - Traveling Route 5**

1. From intersection of Rt. 5 and Rt. 106, travel Rt. 5 east about 9 miles to Charles City Courthouse.
2. From Rt. 5 and Rt. 155 intersection, continue on Rt. 5 east about 1/2 miles to Haupt's Store (will be on your right).
3. Turn left onto The Glebe lane (Rt. 615).
4. Traveling on The Glebe Lane (rt. 615), go 1 1/2 miles (just past the old High School - school will be on your left).
5. Turn left onto Ruthville Road (Rt. 612).
6. The County Fair is 1/2 mile on the right at the Charles City Recreation Center.

#### **From East - James City - Traveling Route 5:**

1. Take Rt. 5 west across Chickahominy Bridge.
2. From the bridge travel approximately 12 miles to Haupt's Store (store will be on your left).
3. Turn right onto The Glebe Lane (Rt. 615), follow directions above (begin with #4).

#### **From West Point, New Kent, and Providence Forge**

1. Travel to Providence Forge.
2. From intersection of Rt. 60 and Rt. 155 approximately 4 miles.
3. Turn left just before Fire Tower onto Ruthville Road (Rt. 612).
4. The County Fair is 3/4 mile on left at the Charles City Recreation Center.

#### **From Richmond:**

1. Traveling east on I-64
2. Exit I-64 at Bottoms Bridge, turn left onto Rt. 60 east
3. Travel about 9 miles to Providence Forge, turn right at stop light onto Rt. 155 south
4. Travel about 4 miles to Ruthville Rd. (Rt. 612), turning left just before the Fire Tower
5. The County Fair is 3/4 mile on left at the Charles City Recreation Center.

Russell Washington, a graduate of Hampton University, is pictured here with his mother, Maggie Smith, a teacher at the Little Elam Pilgrim School. Mr. Washington began serving as the Negro Demonstration Agent in 1912 and held that position until 1940. He was instrumental in establishing the County Fair and in teaching farmers modern methods for planting crops and caring for livestock. During the “Jim Crow” era Washington was one of a very few persons of color to serve as a public official. ## **Charles City County Fair**

### **General Rules**

1. The County Fair will be held at the Charles City Recreation Center in Ruthville, Virginia, Friday through Sunday, September 7, 8 and 9, 2007.
2. Farm, home, and special exhibits, as described within, will be accepted on Friday, September 7 between 4-8 p.m., and Saturday, September 8th between 7:00 - 9:00 a.m. No exhibits will be accepted after 9:00 a.m. on Saturday. All exhibits should be brought to the Charles City County Recreation Center.
3. All farm and garden exhibits must be grown/produced by exhibitor since the last County Fair.
4. All art must have been completed since the last County Fair, and artwork must be exhibited by artist.
5. All handiwork, clothing, crafts and food items must be completed by the exhibitor within the last year.
6. An exhibitor may enter any and all categories. However, an individual may not enter two of the same items, nor enter two items in the same category number unless the rules specify otherwise.
7. Each exhibitor shall be a resident or an employee of Charles City County.
8. All exhibits will be judged in three groups—ADULTS, HANDICAPPED and YOUTH (age 19 and under). Youth will be divided into three age groups: ages 5-8; 9-13; 14-19.
9. All miscellaneous items shall be entered under the category of EXHIBITOR'S CHOICE OR PLACED ON DISPLAY.
10. "BIGGEST HOME PRODUCE" will be judged on SIZE WITH QUALITY BEING SECONDARY.
11. Educational exhibits from the schools must be pre-registered by calling 652-4743 before September 4, 2007. All exhibits should be brought to the Recreation Center on Friday September 7th between 3:30 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. and should be picked up Sunday, September 9th between 4:00 and 5:00 p.m.
12. All clubs, organizations and businesses must apply to the Extension Office for a booth. Concession booths are available for a fee and should be requested by August 17, 2007.

No fee is charged for Educational booths, which should be requested by August 17, 2007. Call the Extension Office at (804) 652-4743.

13. Care will be taken to protect exhibits, but the Committee will assume no responsibility for loss or damage either to person or property.\*\*
14. Exhibits must be picked up between 4:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 9, 2007.
15. Judging will begin at 9:30 a.m. on Saturday, September 8th. NO SPECTATORS WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE EXHIBIT AREA DURING JUDGING, NOR DURING THE REGISTRATION AND SET-UP TIME. Fair volunteers and staff will assist with recordkeeping.
16. Awards for prizes will be 1ST BLUE RIBBON, 2ND RED RIBBON and 3RD WHITE RIBBON.
17. Special recognition will be given to top individuals in each group with the most quality points --- Blue, Red and White.
18. If any item is outstanding in its Department, a “Best-in-Show” ribbon will be awarded.

1. Form refers to the shape of the specimen. The form should be the characteristic of the best type of variety grown in the area.
2. Size should be somewhat above average for the variety. Extra large specimens may be inferior in quality and deteriorate rapidly after they are harvested.
3. Color should be uniform, bright and attractive, and the finish should be smooth. The red overcolor of fruits should form an attractive combination with the yellow or green undercolor. The development of an excessively dark or dull finish is undesirable. The presence of a red blush on green or yellow apple varieties is acceptable.  
 The color of vegetables should be attractive and typical for the variety. Any dullness due to wilting or over-maturity should be penalized, as well as any imperfections in color caused by disease or injury of any sort.  
 The uniformity of the form, size and color of the several specimens of a particular entry is very important. All specimens in each entry should be similar in form, size and color.
4. Condition refers to the degree of maturity of the fruit or vegetable. The specimens should be firm and free from any apparent toughness, woodiness, withering, meanness or other type of breakdown.

Quality refers to characteristics which relate to the edibility of the product and include flavor, crispness, juiciness and aroma. These usually are associated with condition and may be determined by the external appearance and firmness of the fruit or vegetable. In some cases, the product may need to be cut or tasted to determine its quality. A small plug or section may be cut from melons to measure the depth and maturity of the flesh. A few grapes or berries may be eaten to evaluate their Quality.

## **Flowers (Youth & Adult)**



1. The flowers, foliage, container and any accessories must have good size relationships with each other.
2. Vases for the container add a finished look to the arrangement, but must be proportion.
3. Miniature arrangements: No larger than six inches in it's dimension.
4. Potted plants must be well-groomed, free of dead leaves, cobwebs and dust.
5. Centerpiece for a dining table should always be below eye level and small enough not to obstruct the table setting.
6. Single flowers should be free of buds, and the foliage should not be in the water.
7. Terrariums should not be kits.



## **Number of Specimens Per Entry**

The number of specimens to be displayed in each entry is clearly stated in the fair book. This should be adhered to by the exhibitor.

These exhibits will be judged 75% on the variety of the items exhibited and 25% on quality. Please request special entry form and entry tags for Sew-At-Home.

### **Antiques (Adult)**

These exhibits are to encourage preservation and passing on of our heritage, and will be judged on variety, label description completeness, present quality of item(s) and uniqueness. Items should be labeled with Item Name, Item Use, and Estimated Time Period for Use whenever it is know. Details on page 57.

### **“Best in Charles City County” Adult**

This exhibit changes each year. Exhibitors enter the baked item designated. Special awards/recognition is provided for the top exhibitors. Details and Judging Criteria are provided in the department section on pages 59-60.

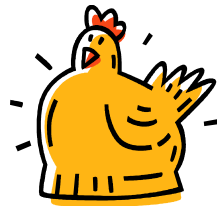
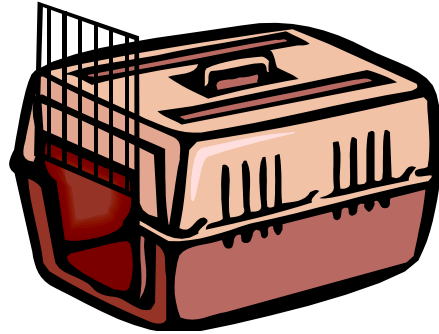
